#### Practical tips for Reading Aloud to Preschoolers

Years of research have demonstrated that reading is critical to a child's development, academic success, and success in life. Take steps to create an environment that fosters a love for reading, and you will equip the children in your care with tools that will set the stage for life long learning.

- Move your finger under the words as you read aloud. This helps children connect printed word to spoken word.
- Point out the similarities in words when you can: tri-cycle, tri-angle, tripod. Can your preschooler notice what these words have in common?
- Ask open ended questions such as, "what do you think is going to happen next?"
- Use different voices to different characters.
